Legion of Mary (Jackie Proto) S:

This report of the actions of Legion of Mary (Our Lady of the Holy Family Praesidium) covers the period since the January 2024 report. Our Praesidium Officers report monthly in person to the Hartford Comitium of the Legion of Mary. The Legion of Mary meets weekly on Tuesdays @2pm at Holy Family Church. We have 12 Active Members and 21 verified Auxiliary Members, each of which have different responsibilities. Our Spiritual Director is Reverend John Golas. Our meetings are held on Tuesday at 2pm at Holy Family Church, but inclement weather prevented our February 13th meeting.

- The works of leading the Rosary or the Tessera prayers and/or the Divine Mercy Chaplet
 continued in eight of the nine retirement or assisted living homes locally (one not available
 due to illness at site). Three Eucharistic Ministers continued to visit people assigned to
 them, including one parish member who requested the Eucharist while recovering from an
 earlier hospitalization.
- The Acies event (specific to all Legionary and Auxiliary members of the Hartford Comitium
 of the Legion of Mary) will be held beyond the Easter and Divine Mercy Sundays, on Sunday
 afternoon, April 14, 2024 starting at 2pm at Holy Family Church. Father Golas will lead the
 benediction. The formal event will be followed by fellowship and refreshments in Fr
 Kerwan Hall. This yearly event is a renewal of our consecration to Mary in the Legion of
 Mary.
- Plans for two other works are still on hold at this time: the formation of a Junior Praesidium
 , and a Parish outreach via informational pamphlets to engage members in becoming
 Legionaries of Mary.
- Two members of the Legion of Mary have accepted the invitation by Pat Keck to participate
 as two of the many presenters in the upcoming Faith Formation's Women's Day of
 Reflection, on Saturday, May 18th. Our presentation will focus on "The Many Faces of
 Mary", as our Legion handbook saturates our spirituality with Mary's key role in our
 devotions and in our works extended out to the people of the Body of Christ in need.

Religious Education (Pat Keck) S:

- Grades K-5 continues to come to class on Saturday mornings at 9:00 a.m. All students have taken the Grade assessment and 98% of all students did very well.
- Grades 3-4-5 will have a penitential service on Saturday, March 9 at Holy Family Church so
 each student will have the opportunity to go to confession. Grades K-2 will have an Easter
 movie and do a craft for Easter.
- Grade 2 received the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Saturday, February 10th at Holy Family Church. St. Bernard School joined the Religious Education program and approximately 42 students made their sacrament together.
- We have a Parent Meeting for the Sacrament of Communion on Saturday, March 16 where parents can have their questions answered and we promote the practice of going to church each week. Communion is Saturday, May 4 at 11 a.m.
- Grades 6/7/8 had their assessment. Most students did well. It is a last effort to see what
 the students know before entering the Confirmation program. Students will have their
 penitential service on Thursday, March 21 at St. Martha Church instead of class for the
 evening.
- Grades K-8 will have a chance to visit all the churches on Good Friday. We are calling it:
 Visitation to the Churches of St. Jeanne Jugan Looking for Jesus. Students will have an
 opportunity to go to the churches and receive a piece of a puzzle that they can put
 together after visiting the churches. They are also asked to visit the empty tabernacle and

- say a prayer. Each piece of the puzzle will a part of a picture of the Risen Christ. They will put it together and bring them back to class for a chance to win a prize.
- Grade 9 continues to come to St. Bernard Church every other Sunday for Confirmation Class. During Father Golas's absence we had Father Federico and Father Maldonado come and speak with the students. They also had a presentation on the Crucifixion of Christ. Good conversation with the students afterwards. Students will be preparing for the live Stations of the Cross. Live Stations will be Sunday, March 24, Palm Sunday 7 p.m. at St. Bernard Church.
- The Confirmation students will be participating in Divine Mercy Sunday at St. Martha Church at 3 p.m., as well as serve parishioners a dinner in the church hall afterwards.
- The Confirmation class will also be doing a class project of sprucing up and cleaning the Mary Garden at St. Martha Church.
- Our RCIA class has prepared two students for the sacraments. They will receive them at the Easter Vigil at St. Bernard Church.
- VBS will be June 24-28. Registration begins on Saturday, April 20, along with registration for the next year for Religious Education. Early registration has worked very well for our families and for our planning for volunteers and teachers.
- Adult Faith Formation continues to have a liturgy group at Holy Family and St. Bernard.
 The Parish Mission will be the week of March 18 in the morning and in the evening at St.
 Bernard Church. Brother Michael Moran, C. P. comes from the Holy Family Passionist
 Retreat Center. Theme: On the Road: Walking through the Gospels and through Life.
- We will be having a Women's Day of Reflection in May. Our theme is "Come to Mary's Heart" at the Faith Formation Center at St. Martha Church on Saturday, May 18. Registration will begin in early April.
- There will be a Breakfast with Easter Bunny with an Egg Hunt following the 10:30 a.m. mass at St. Bernard on 3-17-24. Confirmation students will be there to assist with the breakfast and the easter egg hunt. All proceeds will go to the Steubenville East trip. Special appearance by the Easter Bunny.

- <u>The Triduum Schedule is as follows</u>: the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday will be held at Holy Family Church at 7:00 p.m.; the reading of our Lord's Passion will take place at St. Patrick's Church at 3:00 p.m. on Good Friday; The Easter Vigil Mass will be held at St. Bernard Church on Holy Saturday at 8:00 p.m. Easter Sunday masses will follow the regular Sunday mass schedule.
- Carolyn Dague, who is head of Adult Faith Formation, prepared a schedule of all of the Lenten events and Services that are taking place throughout the Parish. Copies of this schedule are available at all 4 churches in SJJ Parish, and all parishioners have been encouraged to pick up a copy of the schedule.
- The Worship & Parish Life Group is currently discussing a necessary change to the Sunday Mass schedule. A letter from Archbishops Blair and Coyne has directed Parishes within the Archdiocese to scale back their mass schedules based on the attendance numbers submitted for each mass from last year's October count. Our goal, as expressed by Fr. Golas, is to have only 2 masses scheduled each weekend at each church. Currently, St. Patrick Church and Holy Family Church each have 3 masses scheduled on the weekend, including vigil mass and 2 Sunday masses. Therefore, one mass will be eliminated at each of these churches. St. Martha's Church currently has 3 masses scheduled on the weekend; however, one mass is celebrated in English, one mass is celebrated in Spanish, and one mass is celebrated in the Traditional Latin Rite. As each of these masses serves a specific parishioner population at St. Martha, no masses will be eliminated. Back in July 2022, the mass schedule at St. Bernard Church was reduced from three masses to two, therefore, no further reduction will be made at St. Bernard. The reduction in the mass schedule will impact all liturgical ministries, especially the music ministries.

Youth Ministry (Kristen Fitzsimons) S:

Youth Ministry continues to meet twice a month. In February, we participated in the Teen Mass, Stations of the Cross, and began plans for Vacation Bible School in June. We are working with the Confirmation program on the performance of Living Stations of the Cross.

Sign-ups for students interested in Steubenville East occurred in February. Our initial deadline to attend the conference has passed, but we will continue to take teens on a case-by-case basis (as long as chaperone ratios and hotel room reservations allow). We currently have 17 teens attending with four chaperones. This is a big increase from last year when we had 6 teens attend. We have begun fundraising. We have two fundraisers in March, a pancake breakfast with the Easter Bunny after the 10:30 Mass on 3/17 and selling palm crosses for \$10 3/16-17 and 3/23-24. We have 200 palm crosses available for sale. Future fundraisers include a candy bar sale and a raffle during the meal on Divine Mercy Sunday.

Those changes basically provide for 2 high school aged Parishioners to be Ex-officio members of the Council (pg. 2,) and for a 24-hour notice of a change from an in-person meeting to a virtual meeting in the event of inclement weather (pg. 6.)

We will be voting to approve these by-laws on Tuesday night.

Old Business:

- 1. Sale and decommissioning of St. Adalberts church.
 - Dcn. Paul Robert reported that a date is to be set for a walk through a facility so
 that parishioners can find items they are interested in for relocating to other
 churches for acquiring themselves as memorabilia, and the rest will go with the
 sale.
 - Fr. Golas reported that word from Chris Kelly is the proposed sale went to the Presbyteral Council and was approved. Next is the final process to relegate the Church to profane but not sordid use, which is in progress.
 - Fr. John Gwozdz is willing to celebrate the closing mass. He's a native son and said his first mass there.
- 2. St. Martha's parking lot and St. Adalberts cemetery
 - St. Adalberts is ready to go for 2nd week of April with contract signed. Quoted price has been held. With Rafferty there is permission to go ahead with a small cost increase expected.
 - St. Martha's parking lot has enough pavement to grind and use as a base. Work will include all the driveways to Washington and to Brainard. Lot size will be reduced to about 100 cars capacity, and grass will be planted on remainder of former lot.
 - Steve Mitchell reports that Fire Marshal said to add pavement markings showing a
 no parking zone fire lane. He will also get in touch with Rafferty to work out the
 schedule.
 - Fr. Golas told Steve Mitchell to proceed as the finance council is aware and permits are expected.

New Business:

1. Acceptance of By-Laws

Motion to approve the newly revised By-Laws was made by Kristen, and second from Kerri. Josh Sullivan called for a vote, and the motion carried with a unanimous vote to accept. Quorum requirement was met.

2. St. Jeanne Jugan Council Elections

- Discussion was had regarding qualification to be on nominating committee. Kristen reminded council that only members who are not running for council are allowed to serve on nominating committee.
- Vicki provided a refresher on duties of the nominating committee which include: putting together a form for the nominations; calling nominees to see if they're willing to run; getting biographies from nominees; counting ballot results and giving results to Fr. Golas.
- Nominees will be sought from St. Patricks and St. Marthas. Fr. Golas will appoint parishioners to help the committee as needed.
- Nominating committee to be headed by Ralph Williams, with help from Marie
 Pyznar, phone support from Kristen Fitzsimons, and other council members who may step forward.

3. Carnival

- Carnival is scheduled for May 30, 31 and June 1.
- In order to get more volunteer participation, Sue Cotter echoed a suggestion that there be a point person familiar to parishioners in each church that would look for volunteers.
- An email contact list was brought up as a way to broadcast the call for volunteers vs relying on church bulletins or announcements.
- Discussion on reluctance to volunteer based on not knowing what to expect or being unfamiliar with other volunteers.

4. Worship and Parish Life (W&PL) – Revised Mass Schedules

 A letter was sent from Archbishop Blair to the archdiocese about diminishing attendance at masses, and a multiplication of masses that are less than half a church's capacity. A directive was given to reduce the number of masses, which for St. Jeanne Jugan parish amounts to 2 masses per church except for 3 at St. Martha's due to the Spanish and Latin masses.

- The reality of a decreasing number of priests in the archdiocese with many of them over the age of 75 adds to the problem of how many masses can be offered.
- St. Bernards mass schedule was reduced in July of 2022 and meets the goal of 2 masses.
- Masses at Holy Family and St. Patrick's need to be cut back to meet the 2 mass limit.
- Archdiocese sent attendance figures with the letter from a count made in October 2023. For Holy Family, mass attendance high to low: Sat vigil, Sun 9 am, Sun 11:30.
 For St. Pat' high to low: Sat vigil, Sun 10 am, Sun 8 am.
- W&PL met and discussed options and considered suggestions. The decision at this time is eliminate the 11:30 AM mass at Holy Family, the 8:00 AM mass at Saint Patrick's.
- Music ministries that are affected will be meeting with Parish life to discuss options.
- There were various points made and discussion regarding going beyond the required cuts issued by the directive, and to look strategically at the demographics and logistics of the churches in SJJ and perform a polling to better know the preferences of the parishioners, and to create a plan that makes for a more connected parish. Fr. Golas countered that with the uncertainties being faced in the diocese from new directions coming from Archbishop Coyne to the growing priest shortage, that it might be difficult to make large changes at this time as some events may be beyond our control. Nevertheless, he suggested a subcommittee of W&PL could be formed to perform the sizable task of coming up with options that could be considered.
- The majority of the council's time was taken up on this subject due to significant points being raised by members.

5. Facilities Coordinator Replacement

• Jim Daigle resigned as of last Thursday, the 29th of February. We're in the process of hiring a new person. Ryan is our facilities manager for the parish council and will have input on a replacement.

Report: Fr. Golas

- 1. Archbishops Annual Appeal.
 - Last year the appeal made 91% of goal. The goal for SJJ this year is \$245,000. Goal is important to SJJ, because money comes back to town for the food shelf, the Enfield safe Harbor warming center, and Loaves and Fishes.
